

PRIX FRED BAMATTER - SCORING SYSTEM

The aim is to reward clinical and basic research in Perinatology. The perinatal period should be taken in the widest sense of the word, including the prenatal (embryo and fetus), birth, postnatal and follow-up periods. Professor Fred Bamatter (1899-1988) was an outstanding clinician, teacher and researcher. During his lectures, he always tried to link clinical practice to scientific knowledge. Thus, the priority will be given to researchers who attempt to make the same link.

The scoring system used is as follows:

1. Researcher

- 1.1 Originality of research
- 1.2 Clinical relevance of field of research
- 1.3 Publications, total
- 1.4 Publications, first or last author
- 1.5 Quality of publications
- 1.6 Grants (competitive, as principal investigator)

2. Teacher

- 2.1 Didactic skills (overall)
- 2.2 Supervision of PhD students (overall)
- 2.3 Supervision of MD students (overall)
- 2.4 Supervision of Master students (overall)
- 2.5 Teaching of medical students, physicians
- 2.6 Teaching of nurses and/or midwives

3. Clinician

- 3.10verall clinical activities (of the last 5 years)
- 3.2 Number of weeks/year assigned to clinical duties
- 3.3 Number of night and or weekend calls/year
